UNIVERSITÉ LAVAL AT A GLANCE

Located in the UNESCO world heritage city of Québec, Université Laval boasts a tradition of excellence for its academic programs and research activities. For more information.

Language of instruction

• French: Minimum required level of DELF B2.

• **English**: Solely in business administration as well as English literature and linguistics.

French-language test

• BCI: Non-francophone students who are not enrolled in a French-speaking institution must provide a French test result if they don't enroll in French as a second language courses.

• Bilateral agreements: Non-francophone students who are not enrolled in a French-speaking institution will be required to take the French online test from <u>Université</u> <u>Laval's École de langues</u> if they don't provide a French test result.

French as a second language

If your students do not have the required level of French, they can take courses in <u>French as a second language</u> during the summer session, or even during the fall or winter sessions. The School of languages charges activity fees for Français langue seconde (FLS) level courses.

Recommended arrival date One or two weeks before the beginning of classes.

Orientation period and registration

There is a two-day welcome fair "La Rentrée UL" during the first week of classes. Registration is done by the faculties.

Programs available for incoming exchange students

• International profile: According to the agreements signed by each program of studies.

• General Agreements: Admission is not guaranteed. Acceptance is subject to program director approval. Some programs are closed to exchanges; <u>please see</u> <u>the list of open programs.</u> (Available in French only)

• BCI: please see the list of open programs (Available in French only).

Exchange sessions

• Fall, winter, summer (only French as a second language courses during the summer session before the exchange).

- Winter 2026: January 12, 2026 to April 24, 2026

- For the 2025 fall session, exam week is December 15 to December 21, 2025.
- For the 2026 winter session, exam week is April 27 to May 3, 2026.

NOMINATION

Bilateral agreements

- Please send us your nominations with the online form, they will be processed from January 10, 2025 to March 20, 2025 and from August 1, 2025 to September 30, 2025 (*no nominations accepted after March 20, 2025 for architecture and design. No nominations accepted after September 1, 2025 for Education sciences*).
- Once we receive this information, we will verify if it is consistent to our agreement and, if so, we will send a link to an online form to your students. If it is not, we will inform you.

BCI program

- 1. Please send us your nominations with the online form, they will be processed from January 10, 2025 to March 1, 2025.
- 2. Once we receive this information, we will verify the number of candidates (no more than 2 nominations by institution) and the chosen programs (they should not be linked to a specific agreement). We will then send a link to an online form to your students. Their nominations will be analysed by faculties for admission. The decisions will be final.

COURSES

Course selection

The chosen courses must be within the selected study program.

Confirmation of final course selection will be done with the faculty, and is subject to course availability and program director approval.

Students wishing to take a **language course** must take a placement test before the start of the session. Places in these classes *are limited*.

Credit load per session

- Undergraduate: 12-15 credits (4-5 classes)
- Graduate: 12 credits (4 classes) (including language classes)

Contact hours per course

• 45 hours (3-credit course); 15-week session

Number of credits per course

• The majority of courses are 3 credits

Minimum workload per session • 12 credits (4 courses)

Maximum workload per session

• 15 credits (5 courses)

Teaching methods

Lectures, seminars, presentations, team projects, written exams

Minimum GPA requirement (BCI) • B (12/20)

Official transcripts

The <u>original transcript</u> is sent to the student free of charge to the postal address entered on CAPSULE, our online student file. To have the partner institution receive the transcript directly, students must order an extra copy (\$9) from the Registrar's Office before leaving Québec.

Student card and Student ID

Each student will receive a student card and an email address. The student card gives access to the Sports Complex (<u>PEPS</u>), <u>library</u>, etc.

Accommodation / Housing options

•On campus <u>residence halls</u>: A limited number of rooms are reserved for exchange students. Students admitted will receive a special reservation form with their letter of acceptance. Please note that the leases are for 8 months, and students who come for only one session will end their lease as stated in their contract. Additional charges indicated in the rental agreement are thus possible for early termination.
